The Lily of the Cahaba Chapter was organized on February 2, 2008 and chartered the following year with 96 members.

Meetings are routinely held the second Saturday of each month from September thru May.

Our Chapter is one of more than 3,000 DAR chapters across the nation and some 13 foreign countries. Since its founding in 1890, more than 920,000 women have joined DAR.

We are proud to be a lineage organization honoring our ancestors who served as patriots of the American Revolution. Yet we are equally proud of our membership in the Daughters of the American Revolution as a service organization. In 2013, the Daughters volunteered more than four million hours in community service.

As *Today's DAR*, we honor our heritage as we "Celebrate America!" through our combined community service efforts.

Membership

Any woman 18 years or older, regardless of race, religion, or ethnic background, who can prove lineal descent from a patriot of the American Revolution, is eligible for membership. DAR defines a "patriot" as one who provided service or direct assistance in achieving America's independence.

Historic Preservation
